Lymphoma Action's mission is to ensure that anyone affected receives the specialist information and support that they need to help them cope. They also raise awareness of lymphoma and its symptoms, represent patients' (and carers') views to policy and decision makers and collaborate with health professionals and other organisations.</p> <p>Lymphoma Action provide a specialist education and training programme for healthcare professionals with an interest in lymphoma. Events feature expert speakers, updates on the latest techniques and trials, networking opportunities and CPD study hours.</p>
